

CORONATION HALL AGE VERIFICATION POLICY

(IN RELATION TO THE SALE OF ALCOHOL ON THIS PREMISES)

THE POLICY

The Coronation Hall Committee is committed to taking all practicable steps to avoid the sale of alcohol to anyone under the age of 18 years.

The “Premises User” or Personal Licence Holder must give a TEN to Pembrokeshire County Council in order to obtain a temporary licence before any alcohol is sold on these premises. The “Premises User” or Personal Licence Holder must ensure that staff or volunteers involved in the sale of alcohol are made aware of the existence and content of this policy.

Alcohol can only be sold in these premises by a responsible person under the supervision of the “Premises User” or a Personal Licence Holder. Anyone selling alcohol under this supervision must require any individual who would appear, to a ‘reasonable person’, to be under the age of 18 years, to produce on request, before being sold alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and/or a holographic mark.

The responsible person must ensure that any person who would appear to a ‘reasonable person’ to be under the age of 18, be subject to a check of an appropriate identification document.

FOR THE PURPOSE OF THIS POLICY A RESPONSIBLE PERSON IS ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:

1. A “premises user” in possession of a temporary licence having given a TEN.
2. A personal licence holder in possession of a temporary licence having given a TEN
3. Staff or volunteers under the supervision of 1 or 2 above

EXAMPLES OF APPROPRIATE IDENTIFICATION INCLUDE:

- A Photo Card Driving Licence
- A Passport
- A Proof of Age Card Bearing the PASS Hologram •
